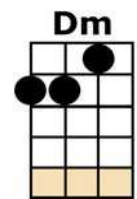
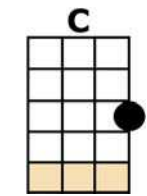
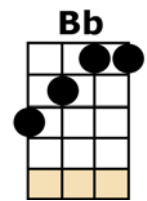
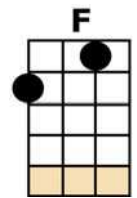


WEAR YOUR POPPY WITH PRIDE
